

The Tioga Career Center is partnering with the Tioga County Chamber of Commerce to host a Job Fair on October 30, featuring a variety of Tioga County—based employers. This event aims to connect local businesses with job seekers and strengthen the county's workforce network. On November 19, the Career Center will host a Human Services Career Fair, highlighting opportunities with Tioga County Personnel Department, Catholic Charities, Pathways, and Unity House.

Throughout November, we will also collaborate with the Tioga County Department of Social Services (DSS) to assist Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWD) clients through WIOA-funded workshops on job searching, interviewing, and résumé writing. About 300 letters will be sent inviting participants to workshops on November 10, 12, 13, 18, 20, and 21, as we await federal guidance on meeting frequency. The Career Center will attend the Winter Resource Fair on November 6 and continues to see record engagement in the DSS Jobs Program, currently supporting 29 participants, with two placed in jobs and one in Truck Driving School. With support from the Broome County Career Center, we also secured an On-the-Job Training (OJT) placement with a local employer.

 Mr. Chris Korba reported that the financials show nine months of Expenses and eight months of Revenue. Projections show a return to local share. The 4th Quarter State Aid has not been received yet. The 2025 budget is tracking well.

# **PUBLIC HEALTH**

- 1. Financial
- Mr. Denis McCann reported that the financial reports show 52% of local share used through September. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter State Aid has not come in yet, will be in November. Fee-For-Services are doing well. He expects to have a good return of local share at the end of 2025.

## 2. Old Business

- Federal Budget Impact None. Some other Health Departments throughout the State are not fairing as well. Ms. Vroman expressed appreciation for Mr. Denis McCann's careful handling of the budget.
- 3. New Business Agency Report for September:
  - Flu season has started. There have been four confirmed cases of flu in Tioga County. TCPH is encouraging people to get vaccines from their primary care providers. To date, nine children were given the necessary vaccines by TCPH, so they were not excluded from school.
  - A retailer in Owego had a second ATUPA violation of selling tobacco products to underage individuals. This is the second violation in a six-month period.
  - Interviews are starting this week for El Service Coordinator. Several applicants
  - At the end of August, a Binghamton University intern started. PH has had interns for years and has MOU's reviewed by Peter with several Colleges/Universities. A PH Educator provides supervision and an established work plan. Ms. Morgan noted that Mental Hygiene also has an intern from Binghamton University. The Legislature would like to be verbally notified when any interns start working for the County.
