We completed our strategic planning session at the January meeting and created some focus areas to work on over the next year. Bringing new opportunities to Tioga County Farmers is an overarching theme. Members from ED&P and SWCD continue to work with American Farmland Trust on the Land Trust Grant which would create 6 workshops throughout the county pertaining to lease agreements, working with nonoperating landowners and farm succession planning. Speakers are scheduled from NY Aq & Markets and Land Trusts to understand the possibilities for farmland protection and easements. Creating programs for large ag tire disposal and ag plastics are at the forefront for brainstorming ideas and searching for resources this year. The Youth Committee will continue to make ARG more visible to all the youth programs in the county and provide resources to them. ARG plans to be very active at the Tioga County Fair and assist where we can with the Pork Chop BBQ. And as always, we have begun planning our annual Sundaes at the Farm event to bring people to a working dairy farm for fun, educational moments and yummy ice cream sundaes!





- ARC/PLC signup is underway, <u>deadline is March 15</u>
- New Crop Insurance Program for Specialty Crops (blueberry, orchard, herbs etc.)
- No information on Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) signup yet, presumably late February or March
- The office is in the middle of doing a complete review of all producers eligibility file. If there have been any changes to any farm numbers, increased/decreased acreages, owner changes, a new CCC-902 is being sent for signature
- Producers who just report hay are starting to receive their 2024 acreage report
- Farm Loan Facility rates have gone down the past two months. Hoping to see them decrease again on Feb. 1. A \$25,000 or less loan requires no financial paperwork. Very simple and quick.

How does your chapter support agriculture? By being visible at county wide events such as the Tioga County Fair and Sundaes at the Farm. We have built relationships with local farm business so we can tour their operations and we have been able to help students gain employment in farm-related jobs.

What's your favorite way to work with your community? We were able to construct and establish a community garden in 2018 with the help of a grant from the Owego Rotary and the support of the village of Newark Valley. Each year we plant crops, tend the beds and do a fall harvest, with the produce being donated at share tables and food banks. Each year we also sponsor a Christmas tree for Lights on the Greens.
